The Four Process Steps of a Restorative Panel Meeting

- 1. Panel establishes common ground
- 2. All understand the impact of the harm
- 3. Person who offended accepts responsibility
- 4. All collectively develop a plan to address the harm

Best Practices / Why Follow the Four Process Steps

- 1. They support meaningful restoration
- 2. They follow a natural progression you can't apologize before you know what you are apologizing for (by "deepening understanding of the harm")
- 3. Adherence to the process helps ensure a successful outcome—**trust** *the process*

Participant Goals

Activities on the Restorative Agreement address the following areas:

- 1. To deepen understanding of the harm; to learn about the impact of the crime on everyone affected (family, friends, victims and community)
- 2. To make amends to those affected
- 3. To make a positive connection with community
- 4. To learn ways to avoid re-offense
