EDUCATION ITEMS

4:30 PM JE called the meeting to order.

Report from Tim Guiles on Town GHG emissions...Work toward 2025 GHG goals (1990 baseline) Need for more advocacy from BEC to Town facilities management/operations.

Opportunities for propane usage conservation, cost savings, etc.

Major energy user – Wastewater treatment plant (more conservation, single pane windows!) Need for new Highway Garage – opportunities to study best approach to a new facility. Variety of energy conservation and electric powered equipment conversions.

6 years of historical data showing flat graph of Town's carbon footprint (1/2 of this is diesel – heavy equipment). Tim suggestion: Explore other communities (U.S., global) of high efficiency heavy snow plow, etc. equipment.

329 Tons/Yr Carbon. By 2025 Goal of 244 to meet a 26% reduction. Propane (20% reduction, focus on HP)...#2 Fuel oil reduce 20%...save 26 metric Tons gasoline shifting gasoline fleet to allelectric.

Tim's conclusion: "We can reach our Energy Goal".

Energy Library

Kathy Clark presentation of how to manage book sign-out/return. RB set up an interim location for the Energy bookshelf. Will be moved to near the drinking fountain after the bike raffle. Rework KC's proposal for Energy Library Instructions to simplify and make a poster. Add Energy bookplates to keep track of Energy books separate from BFPL books.
