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Meeting Commencement

- Meeting is called to order.
- Agenda is adopted as warned.

Select Board Remarks

- Remarks are to be civil in discussions.

Minutes and Warrant

- Motion to adopt a consent agenda for items 3A, B, and C.
- Purpose is to approve the warrant for bill payments, especially important due to the holiday.
- Question about line items for rat poison: Pest control is in place at all town locations.
- Question about Carver Street invoice: It covers the cost of removing waste from the dumpster used for Carver Street cleanup. The dumpster is located at the transfer station.
- Motion and second are in place.

### Reports to the Select Board

- Town Manager's Report:
- Police Department is currently \$123,000 under budget due to not having all budgeted officers.
- Community Development Report (Mr. Moore):
- October 18th: Silent movie showing ("The Magician") to fund the 2026 event.
- October 19th: LC Jazz Fantastic Big band swing orchestra performance.
  - Free will donation event funded by Warren Kimble in celebration of his 90th and 1/3rd birthday.

## Brandon Independence Day and Women's Choral Group

- Donations will benefit the Brandon Independence Day celebration committee.
- October 25, a women's choral group, Maiden Vermont, will be performing upstairs.

### Spooksville Trunk or Treat and Moonlight Madness

- October 24, Colleen Wright will put on the Spooksville Trunk or Treat event at Estabrook.
- It is "a lot of fun and chaos for an hour and 45 minutes down at Estabrook."
- It may lead to a safer Halloween.
- Moonlight Madness is a Chamber / Downtown Brandon Alliance collaboration on December 3rd and 11th.
- The Friends of the Town hall used to rent out space to vendors for a nominal fee upstairs and downstairs. This year that'll be facilitated by the Town of Brandon Recreation Department.

## Public Comment: Garbage Ordinance

- Brett Bueller asked if there is an ordinance against garbage in people's front yards.
- Garbage includes toilets, sofas, appliances, trash dumpsters, broken down cars, and trash bins left on the street.
- There is also dumping at the warehouses at the corner of Church Street and Rossiter.
- The zoning administrator oversees health and safety ordinances.
- There are concerns about abandoned vehicles.
- There is illegal dumping at the bottom of Van Cortlandt Road.
- Identifying the person that did the actual dumping is tricky.

## Illegal Dumping

- Some people are too lazy to go to the transfer station.
- There are cameras across the street from where people are illegally dumping.
- Hannaford picks up their carts that get left there.
- Concerns about health or safety should be directed to Larry.

### Four Way Stop at Park Street and Marble

- A four way stop at Park Street and Marble was discussed.
- Residents along High Street were not in favor of big trucks stopping and starting again due to the noise.
- Ralph and Doug were assigned to work with the PD and Seth on road signage.
- The traffic ordinance is going to be reviewed, and the ordinance working group may give it back to Doug and Ralph.

#### Speeding on Pearl Street and Rossiter

- There are speeding issues on Pearl Street, Church Street, Union Street, and Carver Street.
- "Rossiter's not as bad as Church Street, Union street and carver street. It's 30, 40 miles an hour hour over the speed limit all day, every day."
- There are no crosswalks or pedestrian signage in the neighborhood, except for a crosswalk at Rossiter and Carver.
- Speed bumps could be a solution, and more signage could help.

### Traffic Calming Devices

- When Park Street was redone, traffic calming devices were included.
- Redoing streets could be an opportunity to include traffic calming devices.
- There are streets in town where speeding is a persistent problem.
- Some drivers speed up when they see the 25 mph blinking lights on Garver Street.

# Speed Cart and Speed Bumps

- A formal complaint was made about Union Street, and Seth met with the police chief to discuss it, including the use of a speed cart.
- The road crew is concerned that speed bumps will damage snowplows.
- There are different types of speed control devices, such as speed tables.

#### Police Presence and Enforcement

- It would be good if Brandon had a reputation for strict speed enforcement.
- The sheriff's department could potentially provide speed control, but it would require payment.
- The police department has been under budget due to a lack of officers, and the sheriff's department is also shorthanded.
- As the police department is rebuilt, directed patrols could be reintroduced.

### Carver Street Parking and Sidewalks

- A resident moved from Franklin Street to Carver Street and feels it is less safe for his family.
- Franklin Street has a median.
- There are parking and sidewalk issues on Carver Street.
- Some residents have caregivers who need to park.
- Some sections of Carver Street have medians that disappear and sidewalks that are very narrow.
- Many properties have extended families with multiple cars and shared driveways.
- The topography drops off dramatically.
- The only time people don't speed is when delivery trucks block the road.

### Carver Street Parking and Traffic Concerns

- Speaker suggests painting the sidewalk to delineate it from the road, hoping it will encourage drivers to stay off the sidewalk.
- Speaker notes that Carver Street is narrow, and parking on both sides makes it difficult for two cars to pass, potentially leading to accidents.
- Striping the edge of the new sidewalk on Seminary and Carver is being considered to make the sidewalk more visible.
- Pedestrians and people with mobility devices are sometimes forced to walk in the street due to cars parked on the sidewalk.

### West Seminary Parking

- West Seminary has a distinctive curve in parts.
- Speaker mentions a resident on the street who doesn't want anyone to park in front of his house.
