This project will improve the village (and other parts of the town) in ways not sufficiently provided for by taxation. This project will update the Brandon Workbook that is a companion document to Brandon's Town Plan. The goals of the workbook are to strengthen the strong awareness of the town's importance as an historic and economic resource, and to preserve the charm and character of the unique architectural environment. This project will expand the scope of the document to include areas outside the downtown area of Brandon. It will identify improvements that were made during the Segment 6 project that upgraded the Route 7 infrastructure. The building restoration and maintenance guidelines will be reviewed to ensure the most current information is presented. The Brandon Historic Preservation Commission is coordinating with the Chamber of Commerce, Brandon Museum and the Downtown Business Association to provide a more comprehensive document. The document will incorporate elements of the recently completed Preservation Survey that provided recommendations for identifying and expanding the importance of Brandon's historic assets. Brandon is a study in early American architecture and Vermont history. Brandon is designated as a Vermont certified local government that requires a special commitment to historic preservation through public policy with an historic preservation ordinance. The town has a Historic Preservation Commission that is taking the lead for this project. The original Brandon Workbook was produced in 1986. It was updated in 2002 taking into account the now completedd Segment 6 project that was designed to upgrade the Route 7 corridor through Brandon.
